New Records at our 30th Annual Festival & Games



The 2022 KSFA Festival & Highland Games hosted a great Highland Games competition this year. We want to thank our many sponsors and the hard labors of experienced athletes in setting up the field, scoring, judging, and competing.

60 athletes aged 10–69 competed, with nearly half of the competitors being novices in the sport of highland throwing. Many were drawn through weekly practices held in Kalamazoo and Holland, which began in the spring to train athletes in all nine highland events.

The actual Festival Games included competition classes for male and female athletes; ranging from youth to Masters classes of athletes over 40 years old. Many personal bests for heights and distances were achieved by throwers this year; including a new world record for Sue Hallen in the 65+ women's class. Where she threw the 22# Braemar Stone 21' 3.5"!

New and experienced throwers are always welcome to join our athletes in this fun and demanding sport. It is full of comradery and encouraging competition where athletes coach each other to excel.
